5 are defined as companies that employ fewer than 500 people; these
6 enterprises represent 99.8 percent of all businesses in Texas, and
7 they employ close to half of the state's residents; and

8 WHEREAS, From clothing designers to food trucks, bookstores
9 to auto mechanics, and tech startups to construction firms, small
10 businesses operate in a diverse range of industries and provide a
11 broad spectrum of products and services; the entrepreneurs who lead
12 these endeavors are likewise diverse, with a sizeable proportion of
13 small businesses being owned by women and members of racial
14 minority groups; and

15 WHEREAS, Beyond providing goods and services, small
16 businesses create jobs and stimulate commercial activity within
17 their communities; their role as engines of economic productivity
18 stems from the fact that the businesses often rely on local supply
19 chains, and their smaller size allows them to adapt to and
20 accommodate the demands of local customers and the unique character
21 of their neighborhoods; and

23 small businesses face significant challenges, including economic
24 uncertainty, rising costs, and difficulties in finding workers;
