(e) A temporary certificate issued under this section to an educator who is the spouse of a person serving on active duty as a member of the armed forces of the United States, as those terms are defined by Section 55.001, Occupations Code,

SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the State Board for Educator Certification shall adopt rules necessary to implement Section 21.0521, Education Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025. expires on the third anniversary of the date the certificate was issued or a later date specified by board rule.
